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Executive Director's Report

<u>Introduction</u>

"At the tenth day of the first month the people went up from the Jordan and camped at Gilgal on the eastern border of Jericho. And Joshua set up at Gilgal the twelve stones they had taken out of the Jordan. He said to the Israelites, 'In the future when your descendants ask their parents, 'What do these stones mean?' tell them 'Israel crossed the Jordan on dry ground.' For the LORD your God dried up the Jordan before you until you had crossed over. The LORD your God did to the Jordan what he had done to the Red Sea when he dried it up before us until we had crossed over. He did this so that all the peoples of the earth might know that the hand of the LORD is powerful and so that you might always fear the LORD your God."

Joshua 4:19-24

Just as the LORD had previously brought the Israelites through the Red Sea, so he again showed his love and faithfulness by stopping the flow of the Jordan River so they could cross on dry ground into the promised land. He directed them to pick-up and carry twelve stones from the middle of the Jordan and to set them down where they camped for the night to serve as a sign forever to remind them and their descendants and all the peoples of the earth of the Lord and his powerful action on their behalf.

May they instill in us a blessed sense of encouragement from and confidence in Him – that He who has begun a good work in and through our Flourish Mid-Columbia ministry team, is more than able to carry it on to completion – for the blessing of our community, His world, and the glory of His Name.

voluntarily serves on our Flourish Board – sharing her wisdom, experience, and expertise in Spiritual Formation, among other things.



Program Offerings and Activities

The vision and ministry of Flourish is being implemented and made manifest through a variety of program offerings. The offerings as originally envisioned are depicted below:



As shown, Jesus Christ and His ongoing Lordship and ministry is central. He is the way, the truth, and the life – the One who has created, who sustains, and who holds all things together. To the extent Flourish is enabled to provide any beneficial service for the flourishing of others is entirely understood as a gracious gift of getting to participate, by the Spirit, in Christ's life and ministry to and for the blessing of the world, to the glory of God the Father.

What follows here is a brief "fruit" report on the activities, accomplishments, progress (or not) in each of the above programmatic offerings (moving clockwise around the grape cluster diagram).

Events & Forums



There were no large-scale Flourish Mid-Columbia events or forums conducted during the past fiscal year. Smaller-scale events and activities will be addressed in other program offering areas in this report.

For historical record, two large events were held prior to the past fiscal year and were associated with sharing the Flourish vision and mission.



The first was a "Share the Vision" event held October 27-28, 2017 at West Side Church. Dr. James Houston, founding Principal of Regent College, was the invited main speaker. Jim shared about the vision and founding of Regent College nearly 50 years ago. He offered his wisdom and counsel regarding the then-anticipated launch of Flourish Mid-Columbia. Dan Wodrich shared the vision for Flourish Mid-Columbia as perceived at that time.



The second large event, entitled "A Vision for Vocation" was held March 9-10, 2018 at Richland Lutheran Church – just prior to the formal incorporation of Flourish Mid-Columbia as a nonprofit in Washington State. Dr. Steven Garber and Ms. Rebecca Pousette, both from Regent



College, were the invited speakers. Their sharing about the meaning of "vocation" as a "calling" of and from God, along with their introduction and overview of the Regent College "ReFrame: Connecting Faith and Life" video course was beneficial in helping spread the word about Flourish Mid-Columbia and about one of our key educational resources.

ReFrame Course



Flourish facilitated the sharing of the "ReFrame: Connecting Faith and Life" course with Mid-Columbians in several different ways and settings, including:



- ReFrame was incorporated into the Bible Study Methods class curriculum at Gather4Him Christian College in the Spring Semester of 2019. This class was taught by the Flourish Executive Director.
- Flourish coached and accompanied NWUP Church staff in leading the ReFrame course in the Fall of 2018 as part of the NWUP Adult Education offerings for their church members.
- Flourish led a break-out session introducing the ReFrame resource at the ECO Presbytery of the Northwest annual meeting in May 2019 in Kirkland, WA.

 Flourish conducted the ReFrame course for two small groups of Mid-Columbians meeting for theological conversation on Tuesday evenings and Friday lunchtimes at Gather4Him Christian College and at Northwest United Protestant Church, respectively.

On Thursday evenings in the late Spring and early Summer of 2018, just prior to the past fiscal year, Flourish conducted the ReFrame course at Richland Lutheran Church for a small group of persons from several churches. This course was held in the Friendship Room of Richland Lutheran Church.

Participants in the above ReFrame courses came from a variety of local churches and ministries, including: West Side Church, Richland Lutheran Church, South Hills Church, Tri-Cities Alliance Church, New Hope Missionary Baptist Church, Central Church, and the Tri-Cities Chaplaincy.

Vocational Discernment

There were no "vocational discernment" workshops or courses offered during the past fiscal year.

For historical record, Flourish hosted a "pilot" vocational discernment workshop for a dozen Tri-Citians over four consecutive Saturday mornings in January and February of 2018 in the home of Dr. and Mrs. Lou Koussa in Richland. This workshop was conducted in collaboration with The Institute for Marketplace Transformation who was conducting the workshop live at Tenth Avenue Church in Vancouver, BC. Our local "pilot" group was blessed to view and discuss the IMT presentations via live webstream here in the Tri-Cities.

"Faith &" Vocation Groups



Flourish launched and facilitated a local "Faith and Science conversation" and vocation group initiative during the past fiscal year. Given the demographics of



our Mid-Columbia region, commencing and facilitating a vocation group and conversation in the arena of science, engineering, and technology was and continues to be a high priority. Under the leadership of Dr. Jim Morris, a program planning team was assembled and has been gathering on Tuesdays for lunch, conversation, and planning of the "faith and science" initiative and program offerings.

Our faith and science public conversation was launched in the Fall of 2018 with our hosting of



six live webstreamed lectures given by invited speakers at Regent College in Vancouver, BC, as part of their "Interface" series on theology and science. The Templeton Foundation sponsored the Interface series at Regent. Flourish Mid-Columbia was enabled to

webstream the lectures at no charge. Gather4Him Christian College graciously allowed Flourish

to utilize their Chapel as our venue for these evening gatherings. Speakers included Dr. Alister McGrath, Dr. Sarah Coakley, and Dr. Jenns Zimmerman, among others. Local attendance averaged about 20 people – with nearly 50 different Mid-Columbians attending one or more of the Interface lectures.

In the new year of 2019, the Flourish faith and science "conversation" continued with presentations and gatherings on the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays of each month at Gather4Him. Local speakers shared about why the integration of faith and science was important to them and how it was getting worked out in their own lives and work. In addition, video resources featuring Dr. Alister McGrath and Dr. John Lennox were utilized.

West Side Church invited Flourish to provide a four-week class in May of 2019 as part of their Wednesday evening adult education and discipleship program on the West Side campus. The Flourish faith and science planning team utilized a combination of video-based resources and local speakers to provide educational fodder for the conversation.

Fellows Program

A 9-month intensive "Fellows Program" has been an integral offering of "centers" for faith and work integration in other cities around the country, similar to Flourish Mid-Columbia. During the past year, relatively little progress has been made on establishing a Fellows Program here, given the time and energy that's been devoted to launch and facilitate other program offerings and to build the administrative structure and form necessary for the future flourishing of Flourish! That said, relationships with many of the leaders in other cities have blossomed and deepened and we have access to the resources and curricula they have developed to draw from when we establish our program. During the past fiscal year, Melanie Saint James and Dan Wodrich have started contacting, gathering and reviewing the curricula from other centers such as the Cascade Fellows in Seattle; the Gotham Fellows in New York City; the New City Fellows in Raleigh, NC; the 5280 Fellows in Denver; Framework Fellows from the Center for Faith + Work in LA; et al. The annual rhythm for these other Fellows Programs typically involves an applicant review process in the Spring with the actual program running from September thru May.

Web Resources

With the addition of Scott Johnson to our Flourish Board and team in the past fiscal year, we have been blessed with a person bringing gifts for helping us communicate better – via newsletters, brochures, and webpages. He also brings skill in audio and video recording technology and applications with experience in video vignette story-telling and the production of video-based educational resources. He has significantly improved our website – making video resources from our faith and science presentations easily accessible;

publicizing our Flourish offerings and calendar; providing a way for financial donations to Flourish be received via the web; among many other things. We look forward to his creation of video vignettes of persons wrestling with and experiencing the blessing of integration of their faith, work, and everyday living. In the months and years ahead with Scott's help and the contributions of our Flourish team members, we anticipate growing the number and types of resources we will make available and accessible via our webpages.

Additional Christian Education and Spiritual Formation Classes, Workshops, Retreats

There are a wide variety of ways Flourish is being invited to come alongside to personally accompany, encourage, educate and equip those in our Mid-Columbia community who are seeking an integration of faith, work, and everyday living. A few examples in the past fiscal year include:

- Spiritual Formation coaching of 9 leaders within the Central Church family, both pastors and lay members of the congregation. Members of the Flourish team have led and facilitated 8 meetings of the group during the past fiscal year. We also collaborated with Imago Christi to co-host a 3-day Spiritual Formation Discovery retreat. NWUP Church graciously offered and shared their facilities for the blessing of Central Church. How beautiful when brothers and sisters get along and share with one another what they've been given for the common good!
- Flourish has hosted small theology discussion groups on Tuesday evenings at G4H
 Christian College and on Fridays during lunch in the Flourish office at NWUP. In addition
 to going through the ReFrame course together, participants have been blessed by the
 "Godspeed" video resource produced by former Regent College students, Matt & Julie
 Canlis. The groups have also been reading and chewing on the writings of Professors
 Tom and James Torrance, including their books, "The Mediation of Christ," and
 "Worship, Community, and the Triune God of Grace," respectively.
- Flourish team members have been influential in encouraging local churches to engage and utilize the Imago Christi Spiritual Formation paradigm book entitled, "Mansions of the Heart," by Dr. Tom Ashbrook. Richland Lutheran Church, Central Church, and NWUP Church are incorporating (or are considering incorporating) this resource into their small group training and accompaniment.
- In the past fiscal year, Flourish team members were invited to help plan, lead, and speak at an out-of-town retreat for the men of Richland Lutheran Church, scheduled for September 2019.
- After being blessed by Flourish accompaniment in their use of the ReFrame resource,
 NWUP Church leadership requested assistance in choosing suitable resources for their
 Fall 2019 adult education offerings.
